The latest plantation site at Dolvi, located in Konkan region of Maharashtra is known for heavy rainfall. Even though the site is very difficult to reach because of the hilly area, the plantation at site is in full swing.

On 9th July, the teams of 'Tri-party' agreement - TERRE, Forest Department and JSW were gathered for the plantation. The local communities engaged at work also joined the program. Mr.

R. S. Kadam - Chief Conservator of Forests (Thane), Mr. Manish Kumar - Deputy Conservator of Forest (Thane), and Dr. Vinitaa Apte - Founder Director (TERRE) along with JSW team were present for the program. Mr. Kadam applauded TERRE's enthusiasm and efforts to achieve the plantation target on time. Till date 25,335 plants have been planted at Dolvi site.

Raghunath Dhole, the name is very famous in Maharashtra as 'the person who allocates free saplings of indigenous species'. "Mr. Dhole is the best 'Go-to' person for those

who are willing to gain the Nursery Knowledge," she added.

Mr. Uday Gujar (Chartered Accountant) was also present for this event. "Prakashache Bet is a wonderful initiative by TERRE Policy Centre for glorifying the personalities working on the grass root level," he complemented.

Mr. Dhole runs an open Nursery at Theur, where he gives indigenous saplings at no cost to spread awareness and by which

people will make extra effort for planting more trees. "Making the sapling is not as difficult task as growing that tree is! Out of 100 %, the donor of sapling performs only 1% of the duty, the remaining 99% contribution is of the receiver's. That is why I do not accept any sum for giving the sapling!" explained Mr. Dhole. He also thanked TERRE for nominating him as the awardee and praised all their activities by TERRE.

Kea *Nestor notabilis*



The kea is a large species of parrot in the family Nestoridae found in the forested and alpine regions of the South Island of New Zealand. About 48 cm (19 in) long, it is mostly olive-green

with a brilliant orange under its wings and has a large, narrow, curved, grey-brown upper beak. The kea is the world's only alpine parrot. Its omnivorous diet includes carrion, but consists mainly of roots, leaves, berries, nectar, and insects. Now uncommon, the kea was once killed for bounty due to concerns by the sheep-farming community that it attacked livestock, especially sheep. In 1986, it received full protection under the Wildlife Act.




